This is a list of some things the court staff can and cannot do for you.

<b>We can</b>	explain and answer questions about how the court works.	<b>We cannot</b>	recommend whether you should file a case or what actions you should take.
<b>We can</b>	provide you with the number of the lawyer referral service, legal services program, and other services.	<b>We cannot</b>	tell you what words to use in your court papers or what to say in court.
<b>We can</b>	give you general information about court rules, procedures, practices, and terms.	<b>We cannot</b>	research or interpret the law for you. We cannot apply the law to the facts of your case.
<b>We can</b>	provide court schedules and information on how to get a case scheduled.	<b>We cannot</b>	give you an opinion about what will happen if you bring your case to court.
<b>We can</b>	provide you information from a case file as long as the case is not confidential.	<b>We cannot</b>	let you talk to the judge outside of court or talk to the judge for you.
<b>We can</b>	provide you with court forms and instructions that are available, and check your forms for completeness.	<b>We cannot</b>	take sides in a case or provide assistance that would be unfair to the other side in your case.
<b>We can</b>	give information about court deadlines, but we cannot compute deadlines for you.	<b>We cannot</b>	change an order signed by a judge.
